Position Purpose

Early Childhood Educators will work together to create a child-centred exciting, positive and engaging learning environment where meaningful learning is created, sustained and continuously improved.

Teachers and Educators at King's Early Learners will have a responsibility to nurture the children in their care, establish relationships with them and inspire them to learn and grow in their Christian faith, supporting students to experience learning in a way that meets their needs and supports them to become independent learners who develop a love of learning is central to the teachers' role.

Key Accountabilities and Tasks

Early Childhood Educators are expected to:

- Work alongside Early Childhood Teachers in facilitating the learning and teaching program for children in the ELC.
- Contribute to the implementation of the Early Years Learning Framework for individual children and groups as required.
- Lead groups of children in experiences (e.g. Reading stories, dance and songs).
- Implement daily care routines in a sensitive and respectful manner.
- Actively contribute to the development of a strong, collaborative and supportive team.
- Engage in and support a culture of continuous learning.
- Respect and maintain confidentiality

- Undertake an implement the requirements of the National Quality Framework.
- Maintain designated storage and work areas.
- Implement appropriate hygiene practices (e.g. Handwashing, toileting and cleaning of equipment).
- Assist the Early Childhood Teachers and other ELC Educators with observations of children.
- Participate in professional learning activities and staff meetings as required.
- Actively participate in implementing key improvements identified in the King's Early Learners Quality Improvement Plan.
- Adhere to the ELC Policies and Procedures and complete the required checklists.
- Work in accordance with health and food safety regulations

Essential Criteria

- 1. A personal commitment to the King's Vision, Mission and Values underpinning the delivery of a Christian-based education to students.
- 2. Passionate about teaching and learning in the Early Years.
- 3. Effective oral and written communication skills.
- 4. Empathetic and relational.
- 5. Well-organised.
- 6. High level of attention to detail.
- 7. Reliable, accountable and friendly.
- 8. A high level of confidentiality, trust, integrity and work ethic.
- 9. A genuine heart for Christian Education and the vocation/calling of King's.
- 10. Demonstrated commitment to Christian faith and spiritual development and a willingness to develop these through the role.
- 11. A genuine heart for supporting students, listening and journeying with them, and an encouraging spirit.
- 12. Ability to demonstrate an understanding of the spectrum of learning difficulties and an awareness of the types of adjustments required to support student success.
- 13. Demonstrate an understanding of the Early Years Learning Framework.
- 14. A commitment to ongoing professional learning.
- 15. Demonstrated ability to interact with children and families in a positive, sensitive and respectful manner.
- 16. Ability to model and develop positive relationships with children and foster their social and emotional development
- 17. Ability to work with other team members in the inclusion, support and care of all children.

Qualifications

- ACECQA approved Diploma Qualification
- Current First Aid Certificate (HLTAID004)
- Successful completion of Responding to Risk of Harm, Abuse and Neglect (RRHAN) Training.
- Current Working with Children's Check
- Proof of identification must be provided
- Understanding of the developmental and wellbeing needs of children and how these relate to learning and growth outcomes.

Desirable

- Experience as an Educator in an Early Childhood Centre, preferably as part of a wider school context
- Experience using the Reggio Emilia approach or a genuine willingness to learn and understand the philosophy and practices of the educators of Reggio Emilia or a willingness to learn, adapt, and be mentored in understanding the work of the educators of Reggio Emilia.
- Sound knowledge and expertise in the use of information technologies
- Expertise in implementing programs that promote parent engagement
- Experience with learning interventions for students with EALD, diverse learning needs and/or socially and culturally diverse backgrounds.

Other

Educators will work allocated shifts as per the contract of employment.

At other times, the Educator may be required to perform other duties. These will be requested by the Head of School, Early Years or the Principal, King's Baptist Grammar School.

Terms and Conditions

Due to the operational requirements of the ELC and the need for flexibility in working with parents and children, there may be times when there is a requirement for an Educator to increase or reduce hours at short notice by negotiation.

Educators are entitled to 4 weeks annual leave per year or an equivalent period on a pr rata basis for part of a years' service. The ELC will close for a 2-week period over Christmas when Educators will be required to take the relevant days as annual or other approved leave.

The salary and conditions of this position will be negotiated in line with qualifications and experience and are subject to the current King's Baptist Grammar School Enterprise Agreement.
